William Wascher is Deputy Director in the Division of Research and Statistics at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, where he has oversight responsibilities for the assessment of current developments in the U.S. economy and the preparation of economic projections and supporting analyses for the Board of Governors and the Federal Open Market Committee. Mr. Wascher joined the Board in 1983 and was appointed to the official staff in 2001. He has also served as a senior economist with the President's Council of Economic Advisers from 1989-1990 and as a visiting economist with the Bank for International Settlements from 1998-1999. Mr. Wascher holds a B.A. from the University of Delaware and an M.A. and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Pennsylvania. He has written extensively on the economics of the minimum wage and is coauthor with David Neumark of the book "Minimum Wages," which was published by MIT Press in 2008. Mr. Wascher has also authored or coauthored numerous additional articles on wage and price determination, productivity, labor force participation, and other labor market issues.
